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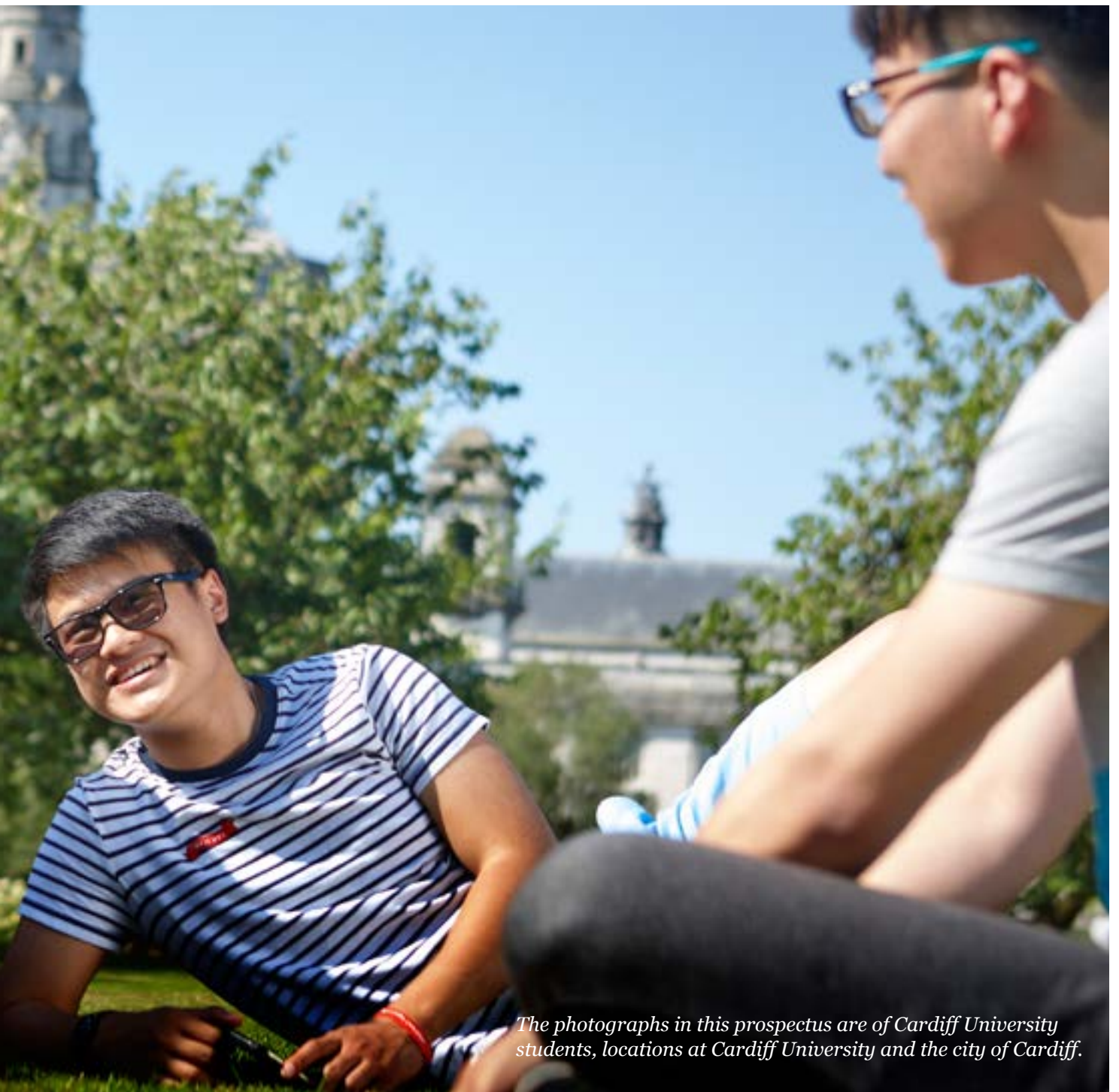

Rankings and league tables

In 2014 Cardiff University was ranked 123 out of approximately 10,000 universities worldwide, putting Cardiff in the top tier of international education. This shows that Cardiff University is an established and recognised university with a global profile. The ranking table above is based on the Research Excellence Framework (REF), based on the quality of our research, a meteoric rise that confirms our place as a world-leading university.

While rankings are a guideline, you should also pay close attention to the course you wish to study and what the university and individual school can offer you.

studying at Cardiff University

If you choose Cardiff University you will join a global academic community of staff and students. Like other established universities, Cardiff University's mission is to accomplish world-leading research and pass this knowledge on to students.



How will studying at Cardiff be different?

Studying at Cardiff University may be different from the style of teaching in your country. You will be expected to use the libraries and internet to research topics. You will be asked to contribute your opinion, collate information and present evidence. Your own ideas will be encouraged. Cardiff University is an innovator in 'problem-based' learning. This means your lecturers will set you a 'problem' and you will have to work out the answer. This is a much more effective method of learning than just from a book.

What is a Russell Group university?

Cardiff University is a member of the Russell Group.

Why is research important?

Universities that are considered to be the best in the world are 'research-led'. Being a taught or research student in a research-led institution like Cardiff University has several advantages:

1 — RECOGNITION

Your degree will be recognised worldwide. The most famous and respected universities are research-led. Cardiff is part of the elite Russell Group of top research-based universities in the UK.

2 — INNOVATIVE COURSES

The curriculum of your course will include the latest information and be relevant to your career.

3 — TEACHING BY GLOBALLY RESPECTED STAFF

You will work with, and be taught by, staff who are pioneers in their subjects and contribute to the advancement of knowledge. It is important to Cardiff University's culture that all our academic staff teach students. In a recent survey of the Russell Group universities, Cardiff University ranked 3rd with regards to learning support and quality of lectures.

4 — ENHANCED CAREERS PROSPECTS

Your career prospects will be enhanced. Employers usually favour research-led universities because they know graduates will be very well informed.

5 — EXCELLENT TEACHING FACILITIES

You will find excellent teaching facilities because research-led institutions attract more funding. Cardiff University generates more than a £460 million annually from research grants and contracts.

Your fellow students will also be of a high standard. This means you will get more out of your seminars and study groups. After graduation you will join a close network of alumni that hold top positions in governments, companies and universities.

INDEPENDENTLY VERIFIED AND REVIEWED

You can be confident of the quality and standard of a Cardiff degree. The University is recognised by more than 40 professional bodies which ensure that the University maintains the highest possible standards in teaching. In 2014 the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA) judged that academic standards, the quality and enhancement of student learning opportunities, and the quality of information about learning opportunities all met UK expectations.

TEACHING METHODS

You will be taught in formal lectures, in small groups (called 'seminars') and one-to-one with the tutors. Depending on your subject you may use laboratories, meet members of the public, operate specialist equipment and go on field trips. You will also have access to Cardiff's virtual learning environment "Portal" to enhance and support your learning. It allows you to download lecture materials, communicate with your tutors and submit assignments from any internet connection.

ASSESSMENT METHODS

Assessment methods are different for each course. Most courses include some form of written examination and essays but you may also be assessed on presentations, class tests, laboratory results and group work.

FREE ASSISTANCE IN ENGLISH AND MATHS

If you want some additional help with English language, or you find mathematics difficult, you can get free support from the University. The 'In-sessional' English courses can help you with presentations, reading strategies, pronunciation and academic writing. Even if you are confident in your language abilities you will probably improve your assignments and increase your job prospects.

How to improve your career prospects?

Cardiff is a highly ranked university, recognised both in the UK and across the world.

On many degree schemes you can also widen your experience by studying part of your degree at a University in another country. Cardiff University has partners in the USA, Australia, South America, Europe and across Asia.

3/ Summer work, volunteer or study placements

As well as spending time abroad as part of your degree, our Global Opportunity Centre provides opportunities for students to work, volunteer and study during the summer months. These placements usually range from 4-6 weeks and are offered world-wide.

4/ Join free training programmes

In a competitive work-place it is important that you can be creative and apply your knowledge effectively. The Skills Development Service (SDS) provides a range of free courses aimed at building your confidence, improving your transferable skills and increasing your employability potential. Certificates are awarded for successful completion of courses and are highly regarded by employers.

5/ Get advice and meet employers

The University has a free Careers Service with specialist international support. They offer advice and guidance on choosing a career, interview techniques, job seeking and improving your résumé, as well as providing dedicated weekly international appointments. They also run scheduled events so you can meet potential employers recruiting on campus.

6/ Enhance your résumé

Employers don't want robots; they want interesting people who are driven and able to work in teams. At Cardiff for example, you could get involved with running a club or society, or join the Student Volunteering Unit.

7/ Gain work experience

Work experience is a great way to show that you can apply your degree. You can get work experience through a part-time job or by opting for a Cardiff University degree that includes a year in industry. The Schools section (from page 19) lists courses which have year in industry options. The University's Careers Service also runs highly competitive 'internship' placements with employers.

8/ Network and build lifelong friendships

The Cardiff Alumni Network consists of 170,000 graduates and supporters across the globe. Professors and other staff will offer advice and direction while other students, both from your country and other countries, can provide valuable insights.

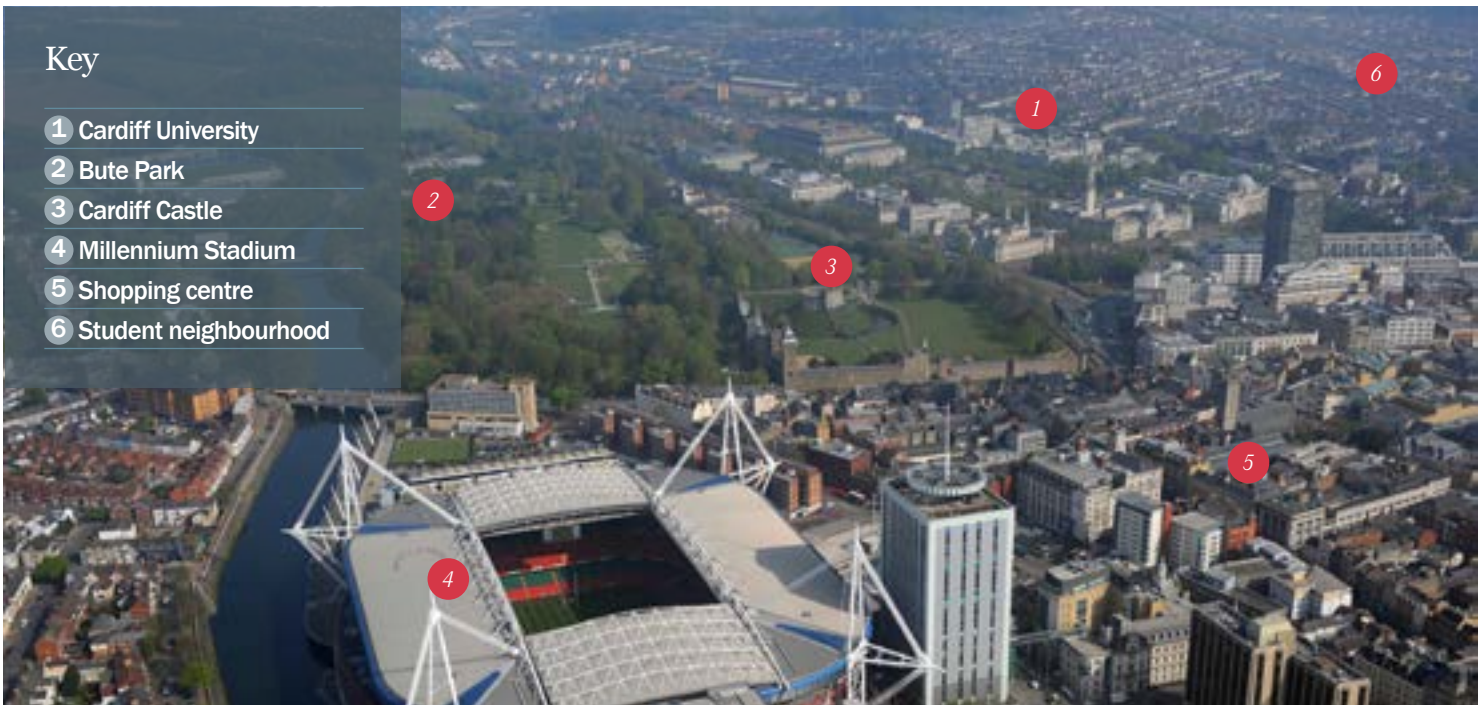

Cardiff is approximately 232km (145 miles) west of London and is easily accessed by train in about 2 hours. The perfect student city

Cardiff is a small city with a population of around 350,000 people. Approximately 20% of the population are students, which makes it safe, friendly and affordable (see page 46). Cardiff, however, is also a capital city with all the culture, sports, shops, entertainment, work opportunities and atmosphere you would expect of a modern European metropolis. This means you get a small cheap city you can easily walk around, but also an exciting city where there is always something to do.

A diverse, international city

Weather in Cardiff

The average temperature in Cardiff in winter is 7 °C and in summer temperatures can reach up to 30 °C. With four seasons, UK weather is generally unpredictable and can vary considerably, however, Cardiff experiences less rainfall than other areas of Wales and is consistent with the rest of the UK.

Safe and supportive

One of the advantages of University residences is the support you are offered. Each residence has a network of residences staff, student wardens and security staff that provide 24 hour assistance.

How much does it cost?

The cost of residences depends on several factors which include the residence you choose, length of stay, meal options and whether you want private bathroom facilities. University residences are very good value as the cost includes water, electricity, security, furniture and internet access. As everything is included in one price, it helps you budget more easily. To help with budgeting there is more detail about living expenses on page 46.

For the 2015/16 year self-catered residences range from £85-£120 a week. Part/fully catered residences range from £106-£128 a week. Rooms with private bathrooms are generally more expensive than rooms with shared bathrooms.

University residences

The University has 16 residences, each with different facilities, in different locations and at different costs.

Your choices include:

- single or mixed gender accommodation.
- private or shared bathrooms. About 70% of University residences have private bathrooms (called 'ensuite').
- self-catered, part-catered or fully catered (with vegetarian options).
- a variety of social and sporting facilities.

You will have your own study bedroom. Cardiff University does not have shared rooms or dormitories.



The University knows that where you live is very important to you. You will want to settle quickly and live in a secure, well-located, sociable and conducive study environment. This is why Cardiff University provides a guarantee of accommodation in one of our highly-ranked University residences.

Close to campus

Cardiff's residences are very well located, with most residences being less than 2km to either the Cathays Park campus or Heath Park campus. The majority of students are able to easily walk or cycle to their lectures every day. The table below gives the approximate walking times from three residences to four popular locations in Cardiff.

Look at the map on page 47 to see where residences are located. You will also find that like the University, residences are within easy reach of shops, the city centre and parks.

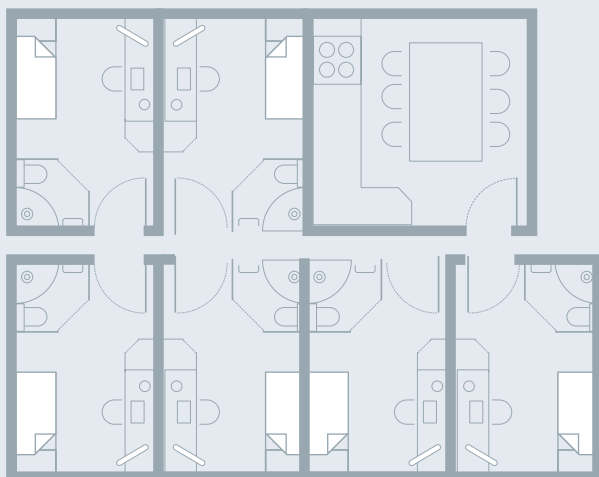

What do University residences provide?

The diagram below shows a layout of a typical flat in University residences.

In this example there are 6 study bedrooms, each with their own bathroom. The 6 occupants share a kitchen. Every student has their own bedroom. Each room has a bed, desk, chair, wardrobe and storage. You won't need to buy additional furniture.

All bedrooms are connected to the University high-speed Wi-Fi network. In your flat you will have access to a shared kitchen/dining room. This area includes a cooker, refrigerator, sink, table and chairs. If you choose 'ensuite' you will have your own bathroom with shower.

How do I reserve residences?

After you apply, and if you accept an offer to study, you will be sent full information on how to apply for University residences.

Coming to Cardiff with your family

The University has a limited number of flats, houses and studios available for first-year international students with family members. These residences are very much in demand and you may have to seek private accommodation. If you do choose private accommodation ensure you start looking as soon as possible and ask for assistance from the University.

Your guarantee of accommodation

You are guaranteed a single-occupancy place in University residences for the full duration of your studies. This is providing you apply through the normal admission and allocation process, and re-apply for residences each year through the overseas returners process.



university life

You might be wondering what life is like for the 30,000 students at Cardiff University. Outside of academia you will find a vast range of opportunities to try new things, meet new people and enjoy the exciting atmosphere on campus.

The Students' Union

- The University's social life revolves around an organisation called 'The Students' Union'.
- Every student enrolled at Cardiff University is automatically a member of Cardiff Students' Union.
- The Union is run by a committee of students and is dedicated to the social and welfare needs of all students on campus. All profits made go back into improving the services available to you.
- The Union building includes a bar, nightclub, concert venue, retail shops, cafes, letting agency and advice centre.
- The Union runs its own student newspaper, magazine, radio station and television station.

The Lounge

Built with international students in mind, this modern venue is situated on the third floor of the Students' Union and is open to all, free of charge. It boasts state of the art multimedia stations with Skype and VOIP capabilities, versatile work spaces, modern meeting rooms and touch screen tables giving students access to international channels and games.

International societies

The best way to make friends is to join a "student society". These clubs are very important to student life and are run by other students. There are more than 120 societies, many of which represent areas of the world including: Canada, Libya, China, Malaysia, India, Pakistan, Nigeria and many more. For two weeks every year the international societies celebrate 'Go Global' – a festival that showcases the University's diversity involving dance, music and food.

Sport & keeping fit

The University takes sport very seriously, and the Athletic Union runs 60 sports clubs and arranges fixtures against other universities. Almost every popular sport is played at the University and whatever your level you will find an opportunity to play and participate.

If you are interested in keeping fit, the University has three gyms and runs classes dedicated to mental and physical well-being.

Orientation

tours of the University and the city of Cardiff to help you find your way around.

social events and parties, including traditional Welsh dancing. These are a great way to make friends.

_5

a bank letter service to help you open a bank account when you arrive in the UK.

Supporting you

Campus horizons

Building on this vision, Cardiff University is undergoing a major transformation of its campus to provide new state-of-the-art research, teaching and student facilities.

This first phase focuses the development of the Innovation campus to provide better facilities for students. The Science and Innovation Campus in Maindy Park will ultimately showcase the University's academic excellence in inter-disciplinary and multi-disciplinary research.

The Centre for Student Life will be a one-stop shop for students, providing easy access, a wide range of student services and advice in a welcoming and modern environment. The centre will offer open, informal spaces for socialising and learning, as well as being an ideal location for large events such as careers fairs and showcase events.

The Master Plan includes the building of a new £44m brain research imaging centre (CUBRIC) that will lead Europe in helping scientists understand the causes of brain conditions such as dementia, schizophrenia and multiple sclerosis. The new CUBRIC will be four times larger than the University's existing brain research imaging facilities and will bring staff from different departments together under one roof, leading to increased collaboration and innovation.

Your relationship with Cardiff University does not end at graduation. As an alumnus you can also contribute to the University's future. By taking the skills and knowledge you learn at Cardiff into the wider world you will showcase the University as an institution that develops the very best graduate talent.

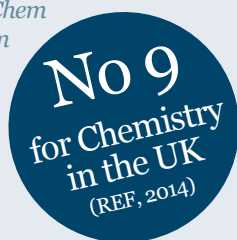

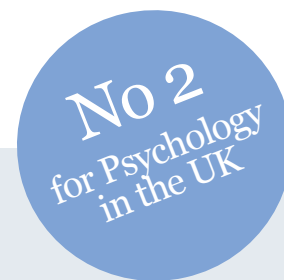

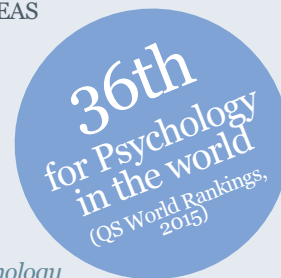

- your home University will permit you to Study Abroad and recognise grades achieved at Cardiff University as contributing to your degree.
- You are from outside the European Union.

Note: for some modules (classes/courses/units) you may be required to show you have certain pre-requisites/ background knowledge.

English language programmes

English for University Study Programme
www.cardiff.ac.uk/elt/efus

The English for University Study Programme is a full-time English language and study skills course in academic English. It is specifically designed for international students.

It is a good choice if you:

- plan to continue your higher education studies at foundation, undergraduate or postgraduate level.
- are looking for an intensive course with an academic focus to improve your general English.
- want to improve your exam performance for university entrance or professional development.

You will need to take a test to demonstrate your English is of an appropriate level.

The programme provides you with the skills and language needed for a smooth transition into academic study. The aim is to develop confident and successful students who are equipped for university study in the UK. Our Academic Schools will accept the English for University Study Exit Test scores instead of IELTS (see our table of equivalences at www.cardiff.ac.uk/elt/efus). Exit tests can be taken in December, March and June.

The English for University Study Programme has three entry points in September, January and April.

Included in the course:

- 20 tuition hours per week (plus self-study and assignments).
- A formal transcript showing assessments completed and indicating your level of language proficiency at completion of the course.
- one-to-one tutorial guidance and support.
- free internet access on all University computers.
- use of all University academic and social facilities, including resource centres, computer workstations, sport and fitness centres, and the Students' Union.

Pre-sessional English language courses

The Pre-sessional programme provides an excellent opportunity for students holding offers from or applying to study at Cardiff University, at postgraduate or undergraduate level, to take short courses in English for Academic Purposes.

These courses are highly intensive and are designed specifically for students who need only a short period of study to reach the required English language entry standard for their academic course.

You can take a course for ten or eight weeks depending on your level of English and academic requirements. The minimum entry requirement for the Pre-sessional course is IELTS 5.5.

Successful completion of a Pre-sessional summer course will usually satisfy your conditions of entry. Some offers will require you to take a recognised English language examination, such as IELTS, at the end of the course to prove you have reached the level stipulated in your offer letter.



how to apply

Applying for a place at University can seem complex but at Cardiff the International Office is here to guide you every step of the way.

Entry Requirements

– Look on the website. We have a dedicated section for many countries. This will give you an overview of qualifications we consider:

– Contact the International Office.
– Contact an educational adviser.

The University has an international network of educational advisers (agents) who give free advice (see the website above for their contact details).

Some courses may require additional information or exams. For example: undergraduate architecture students must submit a portfolio. Check with the School, the International Office, online via the University's course finder or with an adviser.

English Language Requirements

In addition to academic qualifications, the University also requires an English language qualification. The University accepts IELTS, TOEFL and IGCSE/GCSE however the University also considers other English language qualifications, including the Indian Year 12 and WAEC. Different courses will require you to get different scores, however most courses require an average of 6.5 in IELTS or equivalent. You will also be required to achieve a certain grade in sub-scores. Some courses require a higher overall score, especially those that are language-based and require more complex English usage. You should check the website, contact the School or ask the International Office if you are unsure of the requirement. If you do not have the required English language level you may want to study an English course at Cardiff University. More information is on page 42.

How to work out your English level

If you do not have an English language qualification it is recommended you take an IELTS or TOEFL exam. The British Council (www.britishcouncil.org) can provide information on test centres in your country. When you have worked out your level you will know which course is right for you.

How to write your personal statement

All Cardiff University applications require you to write a personal statement. A good personal statement will help you get the edge over other applicants and is your opportunity to tell the University about yourself, say why you're interested in the course and provide details of any relevant experience you have. Below are some tips for writing a good personal statement:

– be enthusiastic

Admission tutors want students that are passionate about the area they are studying. You should write why you are interested in the course, what research you have done into the subject area, and what you plan to do after you graduate.

– include any work experience

If you have any relevant work or voluntary experience this will help show your commitment. For example: if you are applying for a journalism course, include any experience you have working on student newspapers. This is very important for students considering applying to healthcare related courses. The admission tutors will want to be convinced that you understand the demands of working in these professions.

– show you can be part of a team

Admission tutors are looking for students that will integrate and work well with other students. If you have been a member of a team, or held a position of responsibility, you should show how these experiences will help you in your studies.

– include your interests

The University is also looking for students that will contribute to the wider student community. You should provide information on your social and cultural hobbies, for example: community volunteering or playing a musical instrument.

– demonstrate ability in English

It is a good idea to ask someone to proof-read your personal statement, and remember to run a spell-check. Even if English is your first language, you should detail how you have used English since your last English exam. For example: at work, or during your studies.

Common Questions

What if I don't have all my qualifications/transcripts?

You do not need all your qualifications before you apply. You can take exams and submit your results after your initial application.

My studies have been completed in English - do I still need an English qualification?

If you have previously studied in the medium of English this may be sufficient for the English requirement. This is at the discretion of the School. If you believe this could apply to you please state your reason in your application. You may still be required to provide a recognised qualification.

How long will it take to have a decision made on my application?

The University endeavours to make a decision on applications within six weeks, however during busy times it may take longer. If you have not had a response after six weeks please contact the International Office. Because PhD applications are more complicated, they can take longer to assess.

Application procedure

Undergraduate / Bachelors

To apply for an undergraduate / bachelors degree course you need to use an organisation called UCAS and apply online at www.ucas.com. UCAS allows you to apply to up to five (four for medicine/dentistry) courses at any combination of UK universities using the same application form. The institution code for Cardiff is C15. Course codes are listed on the University's website. If you want to apply for an undergraduate degree but only have 12 years of education, you may need to take a foundation programme/year zero. More information on applying to Cardiff University's International Foundation Programme is available on page 42.

Is there an application fee?

Cardiff University does not charge an application fee, however UCAS will charge a small fee, currently £23, to process your application.

When is the application deadline?

The official deadline for undergraduate courses is the 30th June each year. If you want to apply after this date you should contact the International Office. If you are applying for a medicine or dentistry course the application deadline will be October 15th prior to entry in September the following year.

Postgraduate Taught / Masters

You apply directly to the University for a postgraduate taught course. You can apply online at www.cardiff.ac.uk/apply or you can download paper application materials from the website. It is recommended that you apply online because it is quicker and you can track your application.

Postgraduate Research / PhD / MPhil

The application procedure for postgraduate research is the same as postgraduate taught (above), however you will also need to include a research proposal. You should also make contact with a member of academic staff who could act as a potential supervisor to your studies.

- 1 — look at the University School's website to see if there is a member of academic staff who matches your area of research.
- 2 — send the member of staff a short e-mail outlining your area of interest.
- 3 — mention on your application form which member(s) of staff you have contacted regarding your supervision.

If you are unsure whether the School is able to offer supervision for your research you can contact them directly. Email addresses for PhD enquiries are included in the Schools section of this prospectus where you will also find Cardiff University's areas of research.

Is there an application fee?

For the vast majority of courses Cardiff University does not charge an application fee.

When is the application deadline?

Most postgraduate courses do not have a deadline. The University however encourages you to apply as early as possible to avoid disappointment. You will need to ensure you have enough time to complete the application process and, where applicable, get a visa. Some courses can also become full quite quickly. It is recommended you apply 9–12 months in advance of the course starting.



Fees and living expenses

Tuition Fees

To help plan your budget for your time in Cardiff, the University has fixed tuition fees for the duration of the course. This means your tuition fee will not rise.

Tuition fees are different for each course and there may be some exceptions. You should check the website or contact the International Office for further advice.

You can also pay your tuition fees in three installments each year, to help manage your finances.

Funding and Scholarships

In recognition of the outstanding talent of many international students, Cardiff University offers a highly prestigious International Scholarship Fund, designed to attract and reward the best students. In addition to its own scholarship programmes, Cardiff University is also pleased to offer a number of scholarships in association with partnership organisations. Living Expenses

For the 2015/16 session the University estimated that:

- An undergraduate student (September – June) needed £7,841 a year.
- A postgraduate student (September - September) needed £9,833 a year.

These estimates include university accommodation, bills, food, books, clothes, travel, telephone and social expenses.

If you are intending to bring family members, such as a spouse or child, you will need to have at least an extra £460 a month for each family member.

Working Part-Time

Cardiff University is in the middle of one of Europe's fastest growing cities and there are many opportunities for part-time employment both on campus, and in the city. The University's "Jobshop" offers a free service to help you find part-time employment. Usual jobs for students include helping out in shops and at events, call centre work and basic office assistance.

Most international students can work up to 20 hours during term time and full time during the holidays. The University does not recommend you work the full 20 hours during the term because studying in the UK is intensive and you will need to make sure you have enough time to complete all your coursework and reading.

How does Cardiff compare with other places?

Cardiff has many advantages which make it a cheaper place to study than other university cities. These include:

- Cardiff is a compact city and the University is in the middle – therefore you won't have far to travel between the University, city centre shops and your accommodation.
- Cardiff is also very flat making it easy to walk or cycle around. You won't need to spend money on buses or taxis.
- Cardiff council runs bicycle and car sharing schemes. This will make it even easier for you to get around without large extra costs.

Cardiff is also one of the most affordable of the traditional University cities. The table below compares the Russell Group of Universities, and the average cost of rent for students per week.
